New Thrift Wood is the deer-proof fenced area between Little Thrift Wood and Thrift Lane. The moth traps will operate from 19.30h when there will be and introductory talk. The traps will be set up within a short walk of one of the car parks. Which car park will be announced nearer the date. The attended traps will operate overnight. Those interested will need to return early on Saturday morning (08.00h) to see what has been trapped before they are released into the wild.
